Chief Financial Officer, Colorado Lending Source

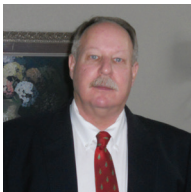

Executive Director, Colorado Lending Source

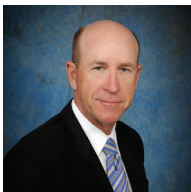

Owner, Trans World Supplies, Inc.

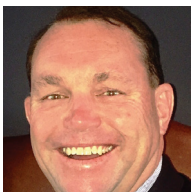
